For the past five years, Rabbi Raachel Jurovics and Cantor Karen Kumin have led the Yavneh community and guests on a spiritual journey through Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, the most sacred holy days of our tradition.

The egalitarian service is conducted in a combination of Hebrew (with full transliteration) and English, drawing from both the traditional liturgy and a variety of modern interpretations. Cantor Kumin, along with our volunteer singers and musicians, inspires us with niggunim (Hasidic melodies), prayers, and songs.

Participants represent a variety of Jewish and non-Jewish backgrounds at every level of knowledge and observance. All are warmly welcomed regardless of affiliation, age, race, gender identity, or sexual orientation. There is no cost to attend, although we do ask that those who are financially able make a donation to help cover expenses.

Saturday, September 24

Selichot (8:30 pm): *An evening of soulful preparation through community, learning, and prayer, including a dessert oneg, as we open our hearts to the new year.*

Sunday, October 2

Erev Rosh Hashanah Service (7:45 pm): *Join us as we begin the Ten Days of Awe, looking to the past and the future as we engage with the High Holy Day process of realigning our lives. Oneg follows.*

Monday, October 3

Rosh Hashanah (10:30 am): *Rosh Hashanah morning worship and Torah service.*

Taschlich (4:00 pm, Lassiter Mill Park): *Toss your transgressions to the fish – and into oblivion. Kid- and dog-friendly gathering!*

Saturday, October 8

Shabbat Shuvah (10:30 am): *The Shabbat between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur is known as the Sabbath of Returning, a time of meditative prayer, reflection, and recommitment to our best selves.*

Tuesday, October 11

Kol Nidre (7:45 pm): *Our Yom Kippur observance begins as we find release from those things that bind us, so that we may more fully discern where we need to go with our lives.*

Wednesday, October 12

Yom Kippur: *Reflection, return, and rededication lead us into the new year with joy.*

Afternoon Service-Yizkor-Ne'ilah (3:30 pm)

Community Break-the-Fast following conclusion of service (approximately 6:30 pm)

Sunday, October 16

Sukkot Festival Celebration with pot-luck dinner (5:00 pm): *Wave the lulav & delight in the smell of the etrog, enjoying the bounty of the fall harvest.*

Saturday, October 22

Adult B'not Mitzvah and Saturday morning worship (10:00 am – note early start time)

Sunday, October 23

Erev Simchat Torah (7:30 pm): *Finish the Torah reading cycle and return again to our divine beginning, dancing joyously with the scrolls.*
